Riverside County celebrates Earth Day at different community events

Starting this Saturday and for the upcoming week, residents and visitors will have the opportunity to connect with the great outdoors, protect the environment and preserve our planet.

RivCo Parks is co-hosting an Earth Day Blues Festival on April 22 from 2 pm. to 6 pm. at Gilman Ranch in Banning. General admission is \$10, \$5 for veterans, seniors, and children, and parking is free.

Then on April 28, it is hosting Arbor Day at Crestmore Manor and Rancho Jurupa Regional Park from 8 am to 12 pm. Waste Resources will be participating as exhibitors in several community events in Jurupa Valley, Murrieta, Perris, and Riverside, including the Community Demonstration Garden in Moreno Valley

It will also offer free household hazardous waste collection even in the same area same day at the City of Moreno Valley Maintenance Yard from 9 am to 2 pm to ensure residents safely dispose of toxic products.
